About Application Eligibility

Application Period

Each year, the Immigration Services Agency of Japan notifies each Japanese Language school of the Certificate of Eligibility application submission dates for the year.

Applications must be submitted at least one week or up to three months prior to the submission deadline.

Admission Procedures

- 1. Applicants who wish to enroll in the school must submit the application form, entrance fee, and all additional required documents specified by the school.
- 2. After screening of applicants who have completed the procedures described above, the school will apply to the Immigration Services Agency of Japan for a Certificate of Eligibility (COE) for successful applicants.
- 3. Successful applicants must pay the entrance, tuition and maintenance fees for 6 months, receive the "Certificate of Eligibility", and complete the enrollment procedures.

Cancellation Policy

If you choose to cancel your enrollment, the following cancellation fees will be charged after the fees have been approved.

- 1. The registration fee cannot be refunded once it has been paid.
- 2. In the event of a cancellation AFTER documents are submitted to Immigration Services Agency of Japan, but BEFORE the release of the Certificate of Eligibility (COE): The Entrance Fee and Tuition Fee will be refunded in full.
- 3. In the event of a cancellation AFTER the Certificate of Eligibility (COE) is released but BEFORE the start of the classes, the Tuition Fee will be fully refunded.
- 4. If enrollment is cancelled after the start of school, tuition fees already paid will not be refunded.

In the event of a withdrawal for personal reasons, the student will be responsible for fees associated with the refund.



Basic Entrance Examination Policy

Admission is based on a review of the submitted documents and an interview.

In the document review process, provided documents and information are verified for accuracy.

The Statement of Reasons for Studying and the Letter of Financial Support are used to determine the applicant and financial supporter's willingness to study abroad.

Interviews are conducted in person on-site when possible. If the interview cannot be held in person, an online interview will be arranged. The entrance examination will focus on motivation and planning, Japanese language ability, and financial capability.

Motivation and Planning

As part of the screening process, we ask all applicants why they chose to study in Japan, why they chose Toyo Language School, and what they plan to do after studying Japanese.

Japanese Language Ability

Previous Japanese Language Proficiency Test scores and Japanese study history will be used to determine a student's motivation to study in Japan.

Financial Capability

At this step, the applicant's ability to study without relying on a part-time job will be verified.

Regardless of Japanese comprehension level, Toyo Language School will ensure that students are not hindered in matters concerning their health or necessary communication with external entities such as service or utility providers.

Prior Consultation for Applicants with Disabilities (Reasonable Accommodation)

Our school provides reasonable accommodation for students with disabilities so that they will not be at a disadvantage during the interview process or throughout their studies after admission.
